TRIP PROFILE

We ride a total of 43 km over 2 cycling days. The cycling takes place in Romania's Dealu Mare wine region and focuses on short, relaxed rides through vineyard landscapes and rural areas. Daily distances are 15 km on Day 1 and 28 km on Day 2, with gentle elevation gain spread across rolling terrain rather than sustained climbs. The riding is designed to complement the wine, cultural, and culinary experiences, with frequent stops and generous time off the bike.

Your guide's expert knowledge of the area and terrain ensures you always know what is coming up in terms of distance and difficulty. This makes a tremendous difference, as does the constant supply of water and refreshments along the way.

Suitability: This tour is suitable for cyclists who are comfortable riding short daily distances on rolling terrain. With rides ranging from 15 to 28 km and a total elevation gain of approximately 555 m across both days, the experience is approachable and unhurried. There are no long or sustained climbs, and the pace allows time for winery visits, tastings, and cultural stops. This trip is best suited to guests looking for a relaxed cycling experience rather than a physically demanding ride.

Biking Conditions: The cycling takes place on a mix of vineyard roads, village roads, and quiet countryside roads typical of rural wine-growing regions. Road surfaces may vary, and riders should expect a combination of well-maintained sections and more rustic rural roads, particularly in vineyard areas. Traffic levels are generally low and consistent with small villages and agricultural regions. While much of the route follows quiet roads, we will occasionally share the road with local vehicles. We generally ride rain or shine, but based on the guide's discretion or your level of comfort, modifications to the planned route can be made. It's all part of the adventure!

Hotels: We have carefully selected comfortable hotels that reflect the character of the regions we visit and provide a welcoming place to relax after each day's activities. In the Dealu Mare wine region, we spend two nights at a wine hotel set among the vineyards, offering a peaceful setting and close proximity to the surrounding wineries. In Sinaia, we spend one night at a mountain resort hotel, well suited for time in the town and visits to the royal castles. All hotels are chosen for their atmosphere, convenience, and suitability for a relaxed cycling and cultural journey.

Day 1: Bucharest – Dealu Mare | Vineyards and First Tastes

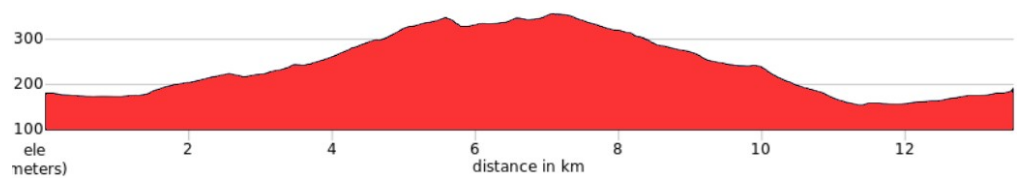
We pick you up from your hotel in Bucharest and begin our journey toward the Dealu Mare wine region. You should plan to arrive in Bucharest the night before the tour begins to ensure a smooth start. En route, we stop for a short private visit at Crama 1777, Romania's historic wine museum, offering an introduction to the country's winemaking heritage. From here, we continue to Gura Vadului and check in at your wine hotel, set among the surrounding vineyards. In the afternoon, we head out for an easy introductory ride through the vineyards, covering approximately 15 km on gently rolling terrain, with a stop for lunch among the vines. Returning to the hotel, a welcome glass of sparkling wine awaits, followed by a private guided visit and tasting hosted by the winery team. In the evening, we gather for a welcome dinner and the first night in Dealu Mare. Please let us know if you need assistance with airport transfers or pre-tour hotel bookings.

Day 2: Bike & Wine in Dealu Mare

After breakfast with views over the vineyards, we head out for a day of cycling through the heart of the Dealu Mare wine region. Today's ride follows vineyard roads and quiet rural routes, covering approximately 28 km on gently rolling terrain. The pace is relaxed, with time to enjoy the scenery and stop along the way. Dealu Mare is widely regarded as Romania's most established wine region, particularly known for its red wines. The area is especially associated with Fetească Neagră, Romania's flagship grape, alongside international varieties such as Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. Riding through the vineyards offers a close look at the

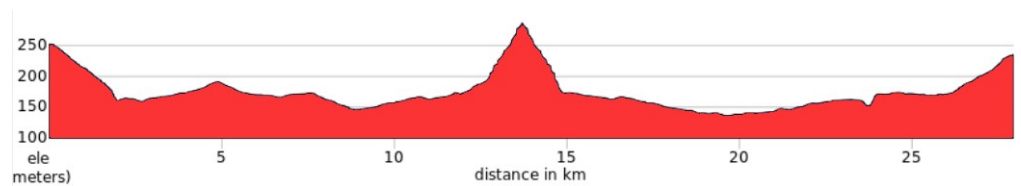
landscapes and conditions that shape these wines. During the day, we stop for a boutique winery visit and tasting, providing insight into local winemaking styles and traditions. The ride continues through the vineyards before returning to the hotel by bike. The day concludes with dinner in the vineyards, rounding out a full immersion into the wines, landscapes, and relaxed rhythm of Dealu Mare.

Day 3: Toward the Mountains & Royal Castles

We leave the Dealu Mare wine region and transfer toward the mountains, travelling via Azuga. The drive takes approximately two hours, marking a gradual transition from vineyard landscapes to the foothills of the Carpathians. In Azuga, we stop at Azuga Rhein Cellars for a tasting of historic sparkling wines and an introduction to the area's long-standing wine tradition. From here, we continue on to Sinaia, a historic mountain resort that became the preferred summer retreat of Romania's royal family in the late 19th century, and stop for lunch. In the afternoon, we enjoy a guided visit to Peleş Castle and Pelişor Castle, two of Romania's most important royal residences, built at the turn of the 20th century and set within forested grounds beneath the Carpathian Mountains. After the visit, the remainder of the day is at leisure, allowing time to explore Sinaia at a relaxed pace. Dinner is on your own this evening before settling in for the night.

Day 4: Departure or Onward Travel

After breakfast, the morning is at leisure in Sinaia. If you are continuing on to Romania: Touring Transylvania by Bicycle, we transfer to Tălişoara, where the next journey begins (approximately 2.5 hours). If you are not joining the next tour, you can travel onward by train to Braşov or Bucharest, depending on your plans. Please let us know how you wish to continue, and we'll be happy to assist with onward arrangements where needed.

Disclaimer: The adventure cycling tours we operate often go beyond the beaten track, and the countries where we ride are not always predictable. Due to these reasons, it is occasionally necessary to reroute or update itineraries. Our guarantee is that we will not change a trip unless for safety or to improve it. Our listed hotels are always accurate at the time of writing, but should we have to change any hotel, it will always be for a similar or better one.

NUTS & BOLTS

Bikes

Because some guests prefer to travel with their own bicycle, bikes are not provided as standard on this tour. However, bicycles can be hired locally for the price listed in the tour pricing section. If you choose to bring your own bike, it should be a road or touring bike in good mechanical condition, suitable for riding on paved and rural countryside roads. E-bikes are also available for hire in limited numbers and sizes. Please contact us in advance to check availability.

Bike Repairs

Basic spares and tools are carried by the guide and on the support vehicle, though we cannot guarantee having spares for every conceivable problem. Carrying a basic tool kit, a spare tube and a pump while riding is recommended.

Safety

Wearing a helmet is required on all our biking adventures and is non negotiable. If you do not wear a helmet you will not be allowed to cycle. Your tour leader is trained in first aid and emergency rescue, but to a large degree you must be responsible for your own safety while riding. It is therefore compulsory that you take out travel insurance that will cover you for a mountain biking tour.

Guides

You will be led by a local English-speaking guide and if the group is 9 people or more we will add another guide to the tour. All our guides are well informed in the history, culture and religions of the area where you are biking and are skilled at passing that knowledge on to you. Your guide is also medically trained and an experienced cyclist, able to handle most minor repairs en route.

THE NITTY GRITTY

Passports and Visas

Romania is a member of the **Schengen Area**. Citizens of the **UK, US, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand** do not require a visa for short-term tourism and are permitted to stay for up to **90 days within any 180-day period**.

Travellers from visa-exempt nations are required to have a valid **ETIAS** (European Travel Information and Authorisation System) approval prior to arrival. This is a digital registration linked to your passport and is valid for three years. Additionally, the **Entry/Exit System (EES)** is operational at all borders, which involves a quick biometric registration (photo and fingerprints) upon your first entry into the Schengen zone. For citizens of the EU, Switzerland, and Norway, entry is permitted with a valid National ID card or passport.

Health & Insurance

No specific vaccinations are mandatory for entry, though it is advisable to be current on standard boosters such as Tetanus and Hepatitis A/B.

Comprehensive travel insurance is essential and should specifically cover cycling and medical evacuation in mountainous regions. If you are an EU citizen, ensure you carry a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), or a Global Health Insurance Card (GHIC) if you are from the UK, to access state-provided healthcare.

Weather

The prime cycling season in Romania runs from **May to September**.

- **The High Passes:** The legendary **Transfăgărășan** and **Transalpina** highways are high-altitude routes and are typically only fully clear of snow and open to traffic from **late June until October**.
- **Conditions:** Summer in the lowlands is warm and pleasant (20°C–30°C), but weather in the Carpathian Mountains is famously unpredictable. Rapid temperature drops and mountain storms can occur even in mid-summer.
- **Gear:** High-quality waterproof layers and thermal gear are mandatory for any alpine sections to manage the shift between sunny valleys and exposed peaks.

Food

Romanian cuisine is rustic, filling, and deeply tied to the land. Key dishes to look out for include **Sarmale** (cabbage rolls stuffed with spiced meat and rice) and **Mici** (grilled ground meat rolls). The dairy heritage is strong here, particularly the local sheep's milk cheeses like **Telemea**. Most meals are served family-style, and our tours cater to all dietary preferences; please ensure you notify us of any requirements at the time of booking.

Drink

Hydration is a priority, especially during the long climbs of the Carpathian passes. We provide ample water and local snacks during the ride. Romania has a winemaking tradition dating back thousands of years; the white wines are crisp and refreshing, while the full-bodied reds like

Fetească Neagră are excellent. For a traditional post-ride experience, you might try a small glass of **Tuică** (plum brandy), a staple of Romanian hospitality.

Solo Travellers

SpiceRoads does not charge a mandatory surcharge for solo travellers. We will arrange for you to share a room with another traveller of the same gender in twin-share accommodation. If a match is not available, we provide a single room at no extra cost. If you wish to guarantee your own private room, a single supplement can be added to your booking at the rate listed in the tour pricing.

Extra Expenses

Romania remains an affordable destination by European standards. You should budget for personal incidentals, tips for the support crew, and unique local souvenirs such as hand-painted ceramics from Horezu or traditional woven textiles.

Money

The currency is the **Romanian Leu (RON)**, often referred to locally as "Lei."

- **Card Acceptance:** Credit and debit cards are widely accepted across the country, including in most rural shops and guesthouses.
- **ATMs:** Cash machines are plentiful in all towns and regional hubs, accepting major international cards (Visa/Mastercard).
- **Cash:** While digital payments are the norm, it is still wise to carry a small amount of cash for tips or for use in the most remote mountain areas where signal for card terminals may be intermittent.

GENERAL BOOKING INFO

If this is the tour for you here's what you need to do to confirm your place:

FLEXIBLE BOOKING CONDITIONS

Booking a SpiceRoads cycling adventure is easy and we try to do everything possible to make sure you have full flexibility and peace of mind. We do not require a deposit to hold your place on a tour and once full payment has been made your money is protected in our client account and you have the flexibility to cancel or change your booking if needed.

CONFIRMING YOUR BOOKING

Just complete our online booking form or send your booking details offline (email or post), and we will confirm your participation. No deposit is needed to confirm your place on a SpiceRoads tour.

You are advised to read our [Booking Conditions](#) in full before you make your payment and should you require further clarifications of any of the conditions below, please [email us](#) or call our office.

TRIP STATUS

There is a minimum number of participants (usually 2) required to enable the trip to go ahead. Once the minimum number is reached, the trip status will change from 'Available' to 'Guaranteed to Depart'. Once a trip is guaranteed to depart you are free to book your flights and make other travel arrangements. If the trip status is 'Limited' will mean we have only a small number of spaces available for booking. If you are unsure about the trip status, please [email us](#) or call our office.

BOOKING ONLINE

From the tour page, click the 'Book Now' link. All departures for this tour will appear, just select the date you'd like to travel. For the next steps, you'll need to know the names of the people travelling. If you wish you can also provide extra details such as passport numbers, height (for bike hire), or you can add that later by logging into [Manage My Trip](#) (we'll set up an account for you automatically if you don't already have one). Our system will contact you from time to time to fill in the missing information, as it will be required before departure. However, if the trip that you are booking offers a child discount, you will have to fill out the date of birth of each rider (so we can calculate the appropriate discount).

BOOKING OFFLINE

Just call us or send an email indicating which trip you want to join and we will happily send you a list of questions and process your booking for you.

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

We do not require a deposit or full payment to book a place for you on a tour.

The balance of the tour's cost (final invoice) will need to be paid 60 days before the departure date with fees for any bicycle rental(s), single supplement(s) and extra hotel nights.

In the case where a booking is made when there are less than 60 days until the tour departure date, the tour's cost should be paid in full within 72 hours of receiving an invoice from SpiceRoads. Payment can be made by credit card using our online payment gateway or by bank transfer. When making payment online you will need to confirm that you have read these booking conditions during the "checkout" process, which equates to agreeing to the terms of services and stipulations as indicated in this document.

In all cases, tour fees need to be paid "in full" before participation in a tour. No person(s) will be allowed to join a tour without fully settling their invoice and receiving a confirmation number from SpiceRoads.

The exception can be made for last-minute miscellaneous fees that can be paid locally (visas, additional local hotel bookings, etc.) can be settled on the day of arrival.

FULL FLEXIBILITY FOR TOUR CANCELATIONS

If the tour is cancelled or postponed by SpiceRoads because we didn't make the trip numbers and the tour can't run, we will make a full cash refund (by bank transfer or on your credit card).

If the tour is cancelled for any other reason, including due to Covid related travel restrictions, we will give you a full credit (with no deductions for admin or any other small-print item) to use on any SpiceRoads tour with no time limit. (Exceptions being flights, special permits and other non-refundable items and these will be advised when booking the trip).

Before paying for your tour, you can cancel your booking with no charge and up until 40 days before departure, you can change your booking to another travel date or move your booking onto another SpiceRoads tour with no charges.

Loyalty Riders Club

For those who have been on several long tours with us, we reward customer loyalty by offering repeat customers a special discount off the tour price (excludes single supplement and bike rental). If this is your fourth scheduled tour or more you will receive a 5% discount. If this is your eighth scheduled tour or more we will extend a 10% discount. The discount will be reflected in your online booking, but please contact us if any questions. Loyalty discounts cannot be used in conjunction with any other offer. Note: Only tours of 7 days or more will be applicable for a loyalty discount.

International Flights

International flights, to and from the start and finish points are not included in the tour price. Once your tour is Guaranteed to Depart you can book your flight. Please contact us for advice before arranging flights for the best arrival and departure times. We would only cancel a trip for an extreme circumstance, but in that case, where we cancel your trip, we cannot be liable for losses incurred relating to any flight booking you have made. Please claim any losses from your [travel insurance](#) that you acquired when you booked your holiday.
